2020 Financial Report

to

January 24, 2021 Church Business Meeting

You will see as we progress through this morning's financial report that 2020 was a year of God's abundant blessings on Paradise Adventist Church!

TOTAL INCOME:

- We received **\$4,016,297** which was down just \$200,000 from the previous year.
- Of that amount, \$1,273,278 (or 31.7%) went directly to the conference in the form of Tithe/Conference/World Offerings (basically 32¢ on every dollar we rec'd).
- Another \$2,743,019 (68.3%) stayed at PAC (or 68¢ on every dollar we rec'd).

PAC INCOME DESIGNATIONS:

- Of the \$2.7+ Million which stayed at PAC - -
 - 2% was designated as Estate monies;
 - 3.63% was designated for PAA & PAE;
 - 7% was designated for Disaster Recovery & Development;
 - Another 7% was received as other income to reimburse Camp Fire Insurance Reimbursements which had been paid out;
 - 20.82% was designated for PAC Ministries use;
 - 29% was designated for Sheds and Love Delivers;
 - 30% came in for other Offerings/Income (including the \$542,000 received from old PAA accounts)

ACTIVE FAMILY DONOR STATISTICS FOR 2020:

- This year we have **115 Active Family Units** in our local Church Family which is an <u>increase of 8</u> <u>families</u> over last year! Our church family is growing!
- Of the \$921,077 Tithe dollars returned by those family units - -
 - 28.7% did not return Tithe or only paid Tithe on a yearly income of less than \$9,000 (probably a <u>partial</u> Tithe);
 - 6.96% returned Tithe indicating a yearly income of \$9,000 \$25,000;
 - 36.52% returned Tithe indicating a yearly income of \$25,000 \$75,000;
 - 27.83% returned Tithe indicating a yearly income of \$75,000 or more.
- Of the \$482,287 in PAC Ministries Fund donations received by active family units - -
 - 33.04% gave under \$100 for the year;
 - 8.7% gave between \$100 and \$499;
 - 9.57 gave between \$500 and \$1,200;
 - 48.7% gave over \$1,200. (And in this category of budget donors, it wasn't just the family units with \$75,000 or more in annual income giving over this \$1,200 level. There were

many families with incomes well under that which sacrificially donated to our Operating Budget. And we wish to give those families our special heartfelt gratitude! It shows a special commitment and dedication to PAC's success!)

- In addition to the support of our Operating Budget (the PAC Ministries Fund), our active local families made other donations - -
 - 21 families gave to Paradise Adventist Academy with a median gift amount of \$719;
 - 8 families gave to our new elementary school on the Ridge Paradise Adventist
 Elementary (commonly referred to as PAE) with a median gift amount of \$943;
 - 27 families gave to the PAC Worthy Student Fund which supports both schools with a median gift of \$1,196;
 - 10 families gave to the Sheds Project or Love Delivers with a median gift amount of \$712;
 - 11 families gave to Disaster Recovery & Development with a median gift amount of \$551.
- In total, our 115 Active Family Units gave \$1,561,975 in Tithe and other offerings to PAC accounts in 2020!
- Another \$2,453,805 came from other sources Shut-in members; Non-local members;
 Attending Non-members; Camp Fire Relief donors from across the nation; grants and bequests.

Now let's turn our attention to Expenditures.

PAC EXPENDITURES IN 2020:

- During this last year PAC spent a total of \$1,751,753.
- **\$853,264 (or 48.7%)** of our total expenditures were spent on **Outreach** programs via

The Sheds Project

Love Delivers

Disaster Relief

Assistance to Camp Fire Victims

- \$379,096 (21.6%) was spent on supporting our **two schools** through Operating & Worthy Student Funds.
- \$240,689 (13.7%) was spent on insurance payouts to replace items or pay for Business Interruption & Extra Expenses.
- \$216,287 (12.4%) was spent on general church activities (from budget and trust accounts).
- \$ 62,417 (3.6%) was spent on other items (from church rental house appliance replacements, to the Paradise Campus Kitchen equipment/upgrades, to Tuan Bui's Vietnam ministry projects).

SUCCESSES IN 2020!

A) We covered all our Operating Expenditures (including support to both schools and Van Transportation costs which had no source of income). Here we have to thank you for your financial support and the fantastic response to our needs during the last two months of our fiscal year. We had a \$172,000 donations goal for the combined months of November & December. During those two months we received \$258,750, of which \$201,629 came in during the month of December alone! Praise the Lord!!!

- B) Our Operating Budget (PAC Ministries Fund) ended the year with an \$85,000+ GAIN!
- C) We were able to fund two necessary pre-fire Depreciation Accounts Parking Lot Repair; Well Pump.

(Note: So as not to create an undue hardship on our smaller church family, the Finance Committee voted to suspend the funding of depreciation on new acquisitions purchased since the fire for a period of at least two years. It will be reconsidered at that time.)

- **D)** Our General Reserves increased by 99% during 2020 to a level of \$273,157.
- **E)** All of our Reserves when combined increased by 328% to a level of \$697,411 (mostly due to the \$540,000+ received from the old PAA accounts now set aside in *Reserves for PAC Schools*).

ADDITIONAL ACCOUNT NOT ON OUR PAC BOOKS:

As we look forward to the day when we can start rebuilding our facilities, we will want to know how much we have to put toward a building program from our insurance monies. Adventist Risk Management (ARM) has indicated our 2018 Camp Fire insurance **coverage totals \$13.977 Million.**

Insurance Investment:

- Of the \$13.977 Million in insurance coverages by ARM, \$9.709 Million was initially released in 2019 to NCC for investment on behalf of PAC.
- In 2019 that investment gained \$692,704.
- From that 2019 gain, the Church in Business Session voted to hire a Business Manager. And thus, we have been privileged to have Mark Lockwood join our staff.
- In 2020 as most of you know (and experienced in your own 401Ks!), first quarter investments received a disastrous blow. The rest of the year investments have been in recovery mode. We don't have confirmation, but it may appear that 2020's investment ended up with a gain of only \$253,000 far short of the previous year!
